

HILTON HALL COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION JUNE 2013 – TREE PLANTING & WILD MEADOW FLOWERS

Over two months ago we ordered 30 small trees – to plant at the Rear of Hilton Hall. One week in May, Debbie & Heather prepared the soil next to the fence by digging-out a drainage trench, in readiness for the planned planting. HHCA took delivery of the 30 small trees and on Monday 17th June (together with Bags of Compost & Soil) and the next Day (Tuesday 18th) all three of us set about planting said Trees. Each 'Tree' is expected to grow a couple of meters in height and spread sideways, so that the established trees will cover the metal Palisade fencing panels. This should not only enhance the look of the place, but will also provide environmental benefits too. The next step (in the summer holidays) is to continue with further landscaping. We hope to plant more Wild Meadow Flowers too.



The two photos (below left) show how last year's planting as developed (at the front of Hilton Hall). The other photos below show how the Wild Meadow Flowers that we planted two years ago have 'come back' to life again this year and they look fabulous once more.
